If you're new to sewing, here are a few tips to help you sew straight lines:

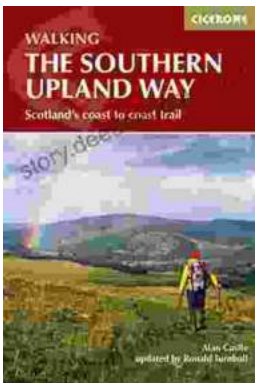
- Use a good quality sewing machine.

- Use a presser foot that is designed for the fabric you are sewing.



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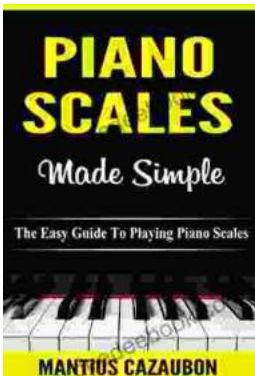
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
