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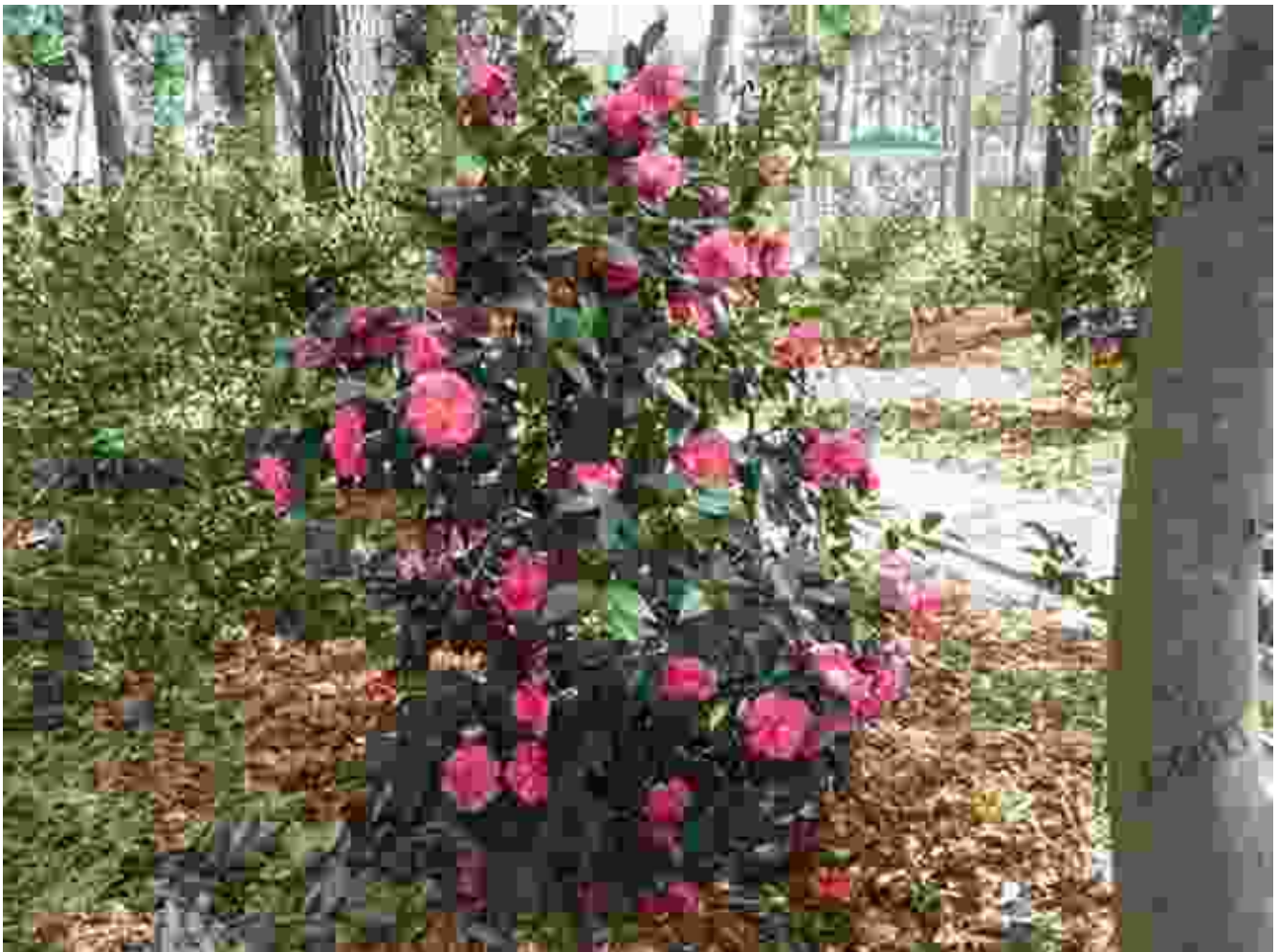


## A Tapestry of Blooms

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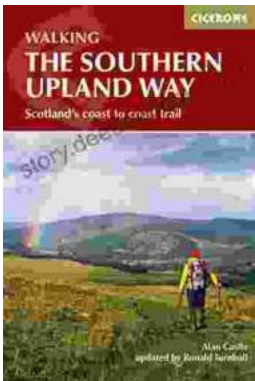
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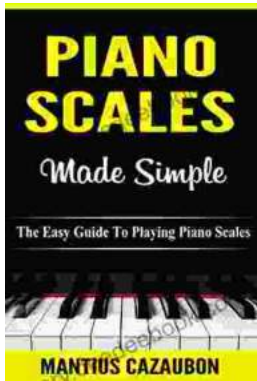


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
