In 1921, Novarro was discovered by a talent scout and signed a contract with Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer (MGM). He made his film debut in 1922's *The*




Novarro was buried in Calvary Cemetery in Los Angeles. He was 52 years old.

Legacy




Ramon Novarro and Dolores del Rio in the 1934 film The Cat and the Fiddle


