On 2 June 2011, a Royal Air Force Chinook helicopter, ZD576, was shot down by the Taliban in Afghanistan, killing all four British servicemen on board. - Commissioning their own independent investigation





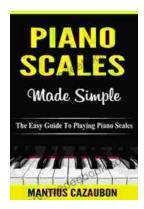
