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Are you a left-handed crocheter? If so, you know that crochet for left-handed people is slightly different from right-handed crochet. But don't worry, this guide will teach you everything you need to know to get started.

1. Holding the Hook

The first step is to learn how to hold the hook correctly. For left-handed crocheters, the hook is held in the right hand. The hook should be held between the thumb and index finger, with the hook facing away from you. The yarn should be held in the left hand, with the yarn tail coming from the back of the hook.

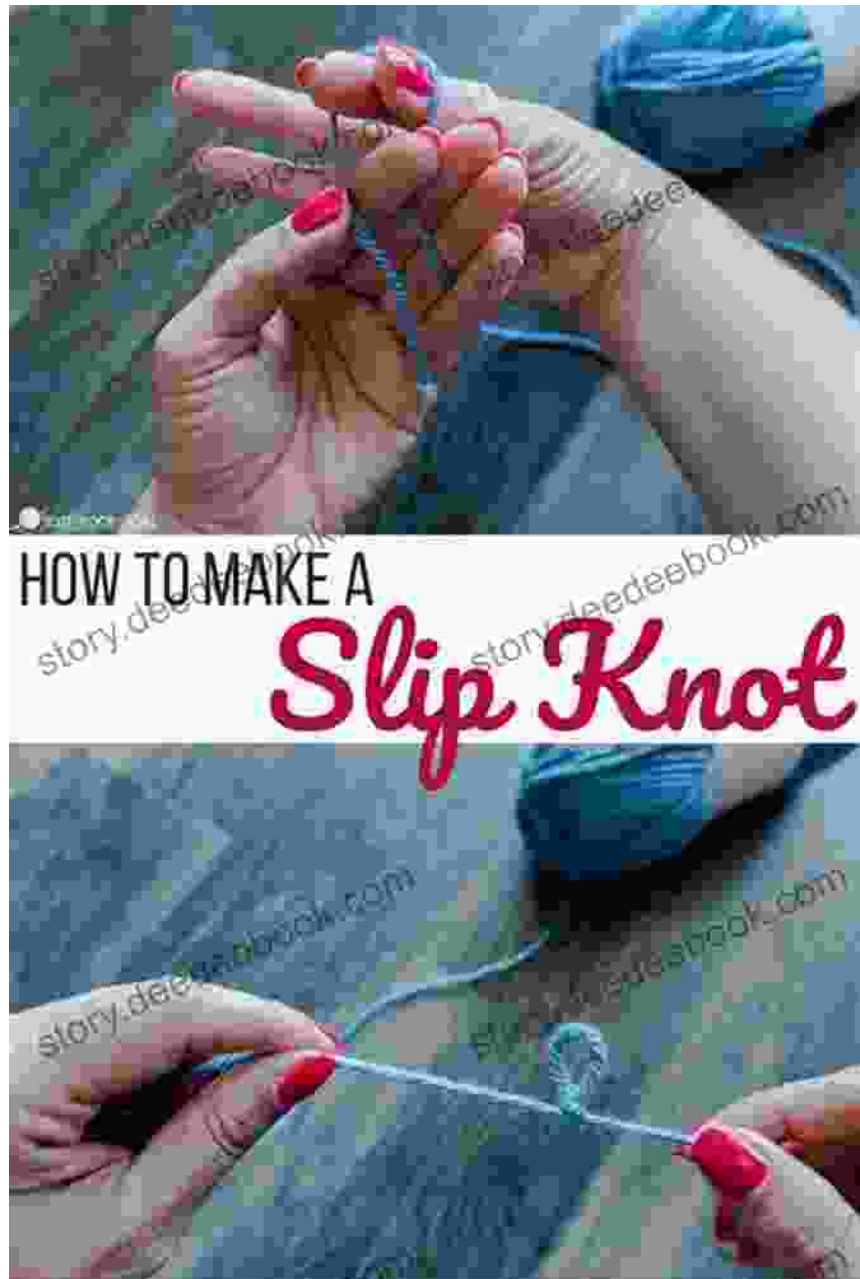

2. Making a Slip Knot

Once you know how to hold the hook, you can start making a slip knot. A slip knot is a temporary knot that you use to start crocheting. To make a slip knot, follow these steps:

1. Make a loop with the yarn, with the working end of the yarn hanging down.
2. Insert the hook into the loop from the back.
3. Hook the working end of the yarn and pull it through the loop.
4. Tighten the slip knot.

3. Making a Single Crochet Stitch

The single crochet stitch is the most basic crochet stitch. To make a single crochet stitch, follow these steps:

1. Insert the hook into the next stitch on the previous row.

2. Hook the yarn and pull it through the stitch.
3. Hook the yarn again and pull it through both loops on the hook.

4. Making a Double Crochet Stitch

The double crochet stitch is a taller and wider stitch than the single crochet stitch. To make a double crochet stitch, follow these steps:

1. Yarn over the hook (YO).
2. Insert the hook into the next stitch on the previous row.
3. YO and pull the yarn through the stitch.
4. YO and pull the yarn through the next two loops on the hook.
5. YO and pull the yarn through the last two loops on the hook.

5. Making a Treble Crochet Stitch

The treble crochet stitch is a taller and wider stitch than the double crochet stitch. To make a treble crochet stitch, follow these steps:

1. YO twice (2YO).
2. Insert the hook into the next stitch on the previous row.
3. 2YO and pull the yarn through the stitch.
4. 2YO and pull the yarn through the next two loops on the hook.
5. 2YO and pull the yarn through the next two loops on the hook.
6. 2YO and pull the yarn through the last three loops on the hook.

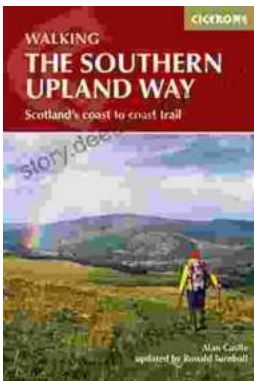


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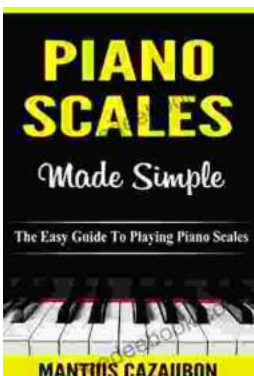
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
